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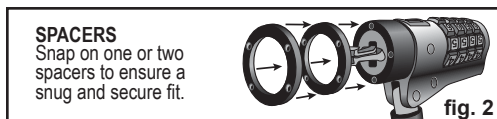

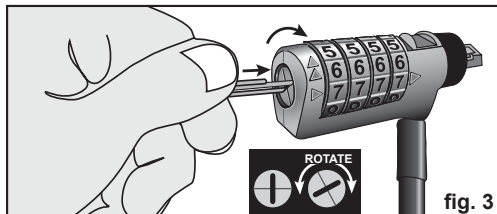

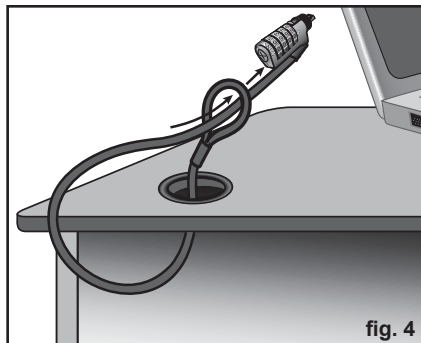

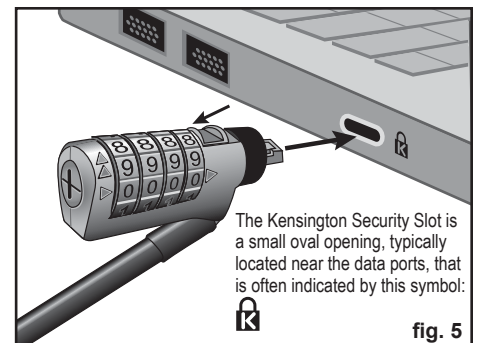

BEFORE YOU START: • Two triangle *Alignment Arrows*(d) are imprinted on the opposite sides of the lock dials for setting and reading a combination. [fig. 1]

• Snap on one or two spacers to ensure a snug and secure fit. [fig. 2]

• **WARNING:** Do not attempt to reset the combination while the lock is connected to a computer. Doing so may cause the lock to become jammed in the computer.

SETTING AND RESETTNG THE COMBINATION

1. **IF SETTING THE COMBINATION FOR THE FIRST TIME:** Line up the dials to display all sevens (7-7-7-7) along the row indicated by the *Alignment Arrows*(d)

IF RESETTNG THE COMBINATION: Line up the dials to display the current combination along the row indicated by the *Alignment Arrows*(d). [fig. 1]

2. Push in the *Reset Button*(c)[fig. 1] with the end of a paper clip or a flathead screwdriver and rotate until it stops (about ¼ turn) in either direction. [fig. 3] Release the paper clip or screwdriver.
3. While the reset button is rotated, turn the dials to the desired combination. Make sure the numbers of the new combination are aligned evenly between the two *Alignment Arrows* (d). [fig. 1]
4. Rotate the reset button back to its original position without applying pressure until the button pops back out.
5. **BEFORE INSTALLING LOCK:** Test your new combination prior to inserting it into equipment to confirm that your combination works. (see "UNLOCKING EQUIPMENT")
2. Write down your combination and store it in a safe place, or register it online at www.kensington.com.

SECURING EQUIPMENT (AFTER COMBINATION HAS BEEN SET)

1. Lasso the security cable to a stationary object (such as a desk through-hole or a cable anchor) by passing the lock body through the looped end of the security cable [fig. 4]
2. Snap on at least one spacer according to fit. If lock is loose after step 4, add another spacer. If locking becomes difficult, remove one or both spacers. [fig. 2]
3. Line up the numbers of the combination along the *Alignment Arrows* (d) and slide back the *Release Trigger*(b). [fig. 1]
4. Insert the lock into the equipment's security slot, then let go of the *Release Trigger*(b) [fig. 1] to fasten the lock in the security slot. [fig. 5]
5. Scramble the dials to secure the lock

UNLOCKING EQUIPMENT

1. Line up the numbers of the combination along the *Alignment Arrows*(d). [fig. 1]
2. Pull back the *Release Trigger* (b) [fig. 1] and slide the lock out of the security slot.
